

Meeting Minutes

Board Meeting, June 4, 2019

The June Board meeting was held at Union 29 in West Des Moines and was called to order by President Linda Hommer @ 7:02PM. Secretary's Report: Judi Nikolish asked the Board if there were any questions or adjustments to her past Board meeting minutes. Nan Brittain motioned to approve the report as written, seconded by Kris Howard and passed. Treasurer's Report: Nan provided the Board with solid financial results stemming from our autocross events at the Ankeny airport. She reminded the Board that the City of Ankeny received payment for permitting CCI to conduct this event and that the Ankeny airport museum received donations from our members and guests for the meals provided. The Board provided the Ankeny airport museum with a separate check last year. Kris Howard made the motion to do the same this year with the exception of increasing the dollar amount since we utilized the airport for 3 full days vs just 2 days last year. Linda Hommer seconded and the motion passed.

Vice President's Report: Kris Howard reminded the Board of our upcoming cruise to Orilla, IA set for Friday, June 14th (details posted in Sportsmate). June 18th is our next General Meeting at Smokey D's. And June 22nd & 23rd is our Chariton, IA. autocross event (car show on the Chariton square Saturday night the 22nd). Corner Workers needed both days. Kris also touched on the August 24th event of Vettes on the River in LeClaire, IA. Governor's Report: Sheila Wyman reported that CCI's Ankeny autocross had some 52 drivers both Saturday & Sunday and 35 on Monday (Memorial Day). In addition to Iowa, we

had drivers from the states of Ohio, Minnesota, Nebraska, Tennessee, Illinois, & Arizona. Our club received many favorable comments as to the professionalism in the manner in which we operate and manage this Ankeny autocross event. Sheila also stated that she had several bills to be paid by CCI, the largest being the repairs made to our generator. We have 11 sanctions remaining for end of year events TBD or we can give them to the Omaha club.

Points Director Report: Wayne Nikolish stated that our club points spreadsheets had been sent to Joe Risius for posting in our Members Only section of the website and that all points had been entered. Membership Director's Report: Jay Hommer reported our club has 126 members.

Concerns as to appointed Board members not returning as well. Linda put together a few very well-done handouts outlining

our Club Committees with the associated responsible officer and monthly calendars listing what specific duties were to be handled during each month. Old Business: none. New Business: none. Next Board meeting: Wobbly Boots on July 2^{nd} .


Flying High at the Chariton Airport.









Thank You Notes. We've received some Thank You notes related to our two speed events held in May and June. See them here and on the next page.



Bonsoir! Mademoiselles and Monsieurs,

As promised last year, here comes Part 2 of my amazing 24 Hours DuMans experience. This time for real, not virtual like at the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green last year. The first thing that stays with you is the noise. This is not a three-hour NASCAR or Indy type event. It's 24 solid, nonstop hours of shrieking, hair-splitting noise!

At exactly 3PM sharp on Saturday, June 15th, 62 cars in four different classes took off. By the end of the first day, ten cars were lost due to mechanical problems. Like last year, the numbers 7 & 8 Toyotas led the race unchallenged. The #63 Corvette C7-R ran a brilliant, steady race, continually picking up positions and leading the GT-Pro class much of the time. The less fortunate #64 Corvette had mechanical issues early and managed to struggle through the night at three places from the end. Finally at 11:30 the next morning, those mechanical issues forced the #64 to retire from the race. Soon after, the #63 hit the wall. The super-efficient C7-R team got the #63 back on the track again with the car two laps down and 50 cars running. Antonio García of Spain continued to drive an excellent race to finish at 3PM.

As expected, the #7 & #8 Toyotas took the first 2 spots overall just as they did last year. A Ferrari 488 GTE Evo took the GT-Pro class win. The C7 era has ended! The mid-engine C8 will be running next year to defend Corvette's honor. Was it an exciting experience with over 267,000 people attending? Oui! It was very much like a giant carnival spread over an 8.47-mile track. I took the optional helicopter tour in order to see the entire area, including the famous 200+ MPH Mulsanne Straight. The giant Ferris Wheel was also a great vantage point just past the famous Dunlop Bridge before the finish line. Would I do it again? Oui, Oui! But not without a real good set of hearing protectors. Luckily, it only happens once a year.


